

#### **Personal Belongings**



### PBIS FOCUS

Positive Behaviour Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is an evidence-based, proactive approach to help build and improve safe and positive behaviours. The goal of PBIS is to teach students positive behaviour strategies, in the same way we teach all expectations within the school; explicitly taught, modeled and reinforced. PBIS includes school-wide procedures and processes intended for ALL students and ALL staff in ALL settings. We are focusing our efforts around 3 common expectations:

- Be Responsible
- Be Safe
- Be Respectful

Students are being recognized by staff members for their positive behaviours. Every month at our school-wide assembly, there will be a draw for a prize for the student and for the staff member that nominated that student.




# Update from the Child Development Advisors

Our Child Development Advisors have been in classes, teaching a program to empower students to become better problem solvers. This program is called Kelso's Choice and reminds students that they are BRAVE and KIND. Our grades 2 - 5 students have completed the lessons, and we are continuing to work with kindergarten and grade 1 students.

The premise of the program is to encourage students to recognize if a problem is BIG (dangerous, unsafe, illegal) or SMALL. If the problem is SMALL, they are encouraged to try at least two of Kelso's Choices before seeking out adult help. If the problem is BIG, they must talk to an adult.


### **Inclement Weather Procedure During School**

During poor weather conditions, we are often asked how we decide whether our students will be staying inside or going outside for physical education classes and/or recesses. Our bottom line is deciding if the weather conditions may present a situation of danger to children. Generally, winter weather in the Airdrie area presents a limited number of days when conditions are dangerous, assuming that children are well prepared and properly clothed. We do not have an absolute temperature cut off when children remain inside. The ballpark number we work with is -20C, but there may be days when children go outside if it's colder (sunny day, no wind) and there may be days when they stay inside if it's warmer, depending on other factors.

NOTE: In extreme cold weather, it is particularly important that students do not arrive earlier than their assigned entry time. Doors will not be open before 8:45 am.

#### **Dress for the Weather**

As the weather cools down and our students continue to participate in outdoor physical education class, active commutes to school, classroom community walks, and daily outdoor recesses, proper clothing is critical for a positive experience and optimal learning at school.



# **Healthy Hunger Fun Lunches**

Our school has a program with Healthy Hunger known as "Fun Lunch". We partner with various vendors every week and families can purchase fun lunches on a weekly basis. The lunches are delivered to the school and distributed to the students. Classes are loaded for the 2024-2025 school year.

Please Note: The deadline to order is 5 days before the lunch date, so typically our order deadline is Saturday at midnight! If your student is absent on the day of fun lunch, please call the office by noon, if you will be coming to pick up the lunch OR if you would like the lunch kept for when your student returns. If your child is not at school, and we do not hear from the family, the lunch WILL NOT be kept for the student. Pickups will be available at the office after 1:00 pm.

Did you know that fun lunch is a fundraising program? A portion of the proceeds from each lunch ordered go back to the school. We use these funds to support our school community, such as field trips, school dances and events, curricular projects, active living week and more!
